

Sixiang Wang

Sixiang Wang is an assistant professor of Asian Languages and Cultures at UCLA. He is a historian of Chosŏn Korea and early modern East Asia.

His forthcoming book, *Boundless Winds of Empire: Rhetoric and Ritual in Early Chosŏn Diplomacy with Ming China* reconstructs the cultural strategies of Korean diplomacy with Ming empire in the fifteenth and sixteenth centuries.

It underscores how Korean ritual and literary practices inserted Chosŏn into the Ming empire's legitimating strategies and established Korea as a stakeholder in a shared imperial tradition.

He teaches courses on Korea's pre-nineteenth-century history and the history of cultural and intellectual interactions in early modern East Asia.
