Institute for Sinographic Literatures and Philology. Between 2013 and 2021, I was the chief researcher at the Daedong Institute for Korean Studies at Sungkyunkwan University, leading a project team to construct a Yeonhaeng (燕行) texts database. Following this, I worked as a translation researcher at the Toegye Studies Institute from 2021 to 2022. Currently, I am an HK research professor at the Academy of East Asian Studies in Sungkyunkwan University, where I also teach courses in the Department of Korean Literature in Classical Chinese and in the Interdisciplinary Program of Korean Studies. My publications include several books, such as 『조선 지식인이 세상을 여행하는 법』(2016) and 『낭송 연행록』(2019), along with numerous Korean translations of poems and Yeonhaeng (燕行) related documents written in Classical Chinese. My ongoing research focuses on the middle class in Joseon and their experiences abroad.
