The issue of care work

- Key for growth, well-being, inclusion (EU Care strategy)
- Financial and social sustainability
- Problematic balance «uncovered» by the pandemic :
 - quality of work
 - quality of care

Residential care

- Neglected dimension
- Research in Nordic and and Anglo-Saxon countries:
 - Lens of «privatization»/ «deprofessionalization»
- Knowledge gap in Southern Europe
- Problematic framework transfer

The Italian case

- Scant and fragmented provision
- Delegitimation
- Fragmentation of providers and of labour:
 - · Beyond public/private
 - Hybrid forms
 - High number of collective agreements
- Complex regulation
- Limited knowledge
- New framework needed








Aims & methods

- Filling the knowledge gap on quality of care work in residential care in Italy

1. A new perspective on quality of work

Grasping «quality of work»

- Relationship between workers' needs and organisation of activities
- Dimensions:
 - Quality of the job (intrinsic)
 - Quality of employment (extrinsic)
- Workers' profile:
 - Expectations
 - Meaning of work

Determinants

- Macro:
 - Care/welfare/employment regimes
 - Regulation of care, labour and migration
- Meso:
 - (inter)Organisational features
- Micro:
 - Individual and group strategies
 - Theories of care (devaluation/prisoners of love)

Integrated framework

- Analysing fostering and hindering factors
- Connecting levels
- Configurational approach
- Theoretical work close to empirical data







2. Getting to know quality of work in residential care in Italy

Working conditions

- Overall picture:
 - Territorial patterns
 - Change over time
 - Sub-sectorial patterns
- Secondary quantitative analysis:
 - LFS
 - Nurses/care assistants

Mapping regulation and provision

- Care:
 - Funding and organisation
 - Providers
- Employment:
 - Contracts (collective agreements)
 - Pay and working conditions
- Migration:
 - Routes to care employment
- Analysis of policy documents, legislation, institutional data...







3. In depth analysis of quality of care in three Regions: Emilia-Romagna, Lombardy, Veneto

Care workers

- Overcoming limitations of available quantitative data:
 - Information on health, subjective wellbeing, stress, etc.
 - Connecting institutional and organizational features with (perceived) quality of work
 - Retrospective analysis
- Experiences, perceptions
- Qualitative survey (120 interviews):
 - Care workers
 - Non-representative, theoretical sample
 - "Types" of workers based on previous analysis
- Fuzzy-set, QCA:
 - Configurations of conditions leading to high and low quality of work

Residential care organisations

- Understanding what hinders or boosts quality of care within residential care organisations
- Six organisational case studies:
 - Challenges and tensions
 - Solutions
