| | Key themes include the valorization of local cultural heritage , the importance of bottom-up initiatives , and the active role of local actors and public administrations in enabling and sustaining innovation. The seminars will also reflect on how local challenges—including tensions and conflicts—shape the design and implementation of socially innovative projects . Special attention will be paid to initiatives that help preserve the material and immaterial memory of places while responding to contemporary needs, in touristic destinations and in destinations where tourism is rapidly expanding. | |

Geoheritage and Geotourism: Insights from a Geopark Context Description

Research Fellow for the iNEST Project – Spoke 6 "Tourism, Culture and Creative Industries". Geological heritage encompasses components of Earth's geodiversity that are considered significant for conservation. It includes a range of minerals, rocks, fossils, landforms, and geomorphological features that provide insights into Earth's evolution and the development of Earth sciences. The design of a Geotourism strategy for Geoheritage fosters a compromise to preserve and promote the territory's identity by integrating its geology, environment, culture, aesthetics, heritage, and residents' well-being. Guided by the design thinking process, this study aims to advance with strategic insights to guide a Geotourism development path in the Geopark Algarvensis, located in the central Algarve, south of Portugal. The Geopark Algarvensis offers an opportunity to diversify tourism beyond the traditional mass "Sun and Sea" model, which has contributed to environmental degradation, overcrowding, and economic seasonality. By promoting geological, natural, and cultural heritage, the initiative seeks to establish a sustainable and inclusive tourism model through Geotourism as a comprehensive and transformative approach to managing territories with geological significance. Resulting from a collaborative work between the Geopark Algarvensis, the Research Centre for Tourism, Sustainability and Well-being (CinTurs), and the University of Algarve, a set of

strategic insights to guide the creation of a Geotourism development path in the Geopark Algarvensis was put forward. Led by literature and by adopting participatory methodologies, strategic collaboration, community participation, and storytelling informed the advancement of critical drivers for innovation in a Geotourism stage.
